On the above referenced date and time I, Officer K. Pixler crossed the street to enter the Phoenix Building. Two Courthouse Café employees stopped me and pointed to an electronic device located between the planters in front of and near the doors to the Phoenix Building and Courthouse Café. I told the men and surrounding persons to back away and as I also backed away, I called Lt. G Glasper on the radio regarding the found device. The two men indentified as John McGovern, [REDACTED], employee and hot dog stand man and Justin Mata, [REDACTED] Kitchen Manager both of Courthouse Café stated a man had placed the device there and they were concerned. Mr. Mata and Mr. McGovern stated a white van circa 1979 had been parked there and they had noticed the van the day before. Upon arrival of Lt. G. George Glasper, I was advised to clear the Judges from the 11th floor of the Phoenix building. I advised the Senior Judges and their JEA of the situation and escorted them to the west stairwell door and advised them to go across into the RJC for safety purposes. I then advised Officer J. Crenshaw of the situation, that I was removing the Senior Judges and why. Officer A. Newcomb came out and was already aware of the situation and removed her staff. I returned to the street and assisted other officers in clearing the area; next to the Phoenix Building, the alley, and later the garage on the corner of Lewis/Casino Center. I also advised the Phoenix building parking garage attendants to direct any cars leaving north away from the building. Officer J. Wooten walked the alley to clear it. At this time I asked the attendants if they had noticed a white van around the area. One attendant, indentified as Vincent Lozano, [REDACTED] advised me that he had seen a large white cargo type van circa 1970's to 1980's parking on the street, then leaving, then coming back. Mr. Lozano stated the van had an air conditioner type unit on top and sliding doors and some windows. Mr. Lozano also stated the van was "beat-up" looking and was driven by a WMA, older and balding. I advised all officers of the description over the radio and also advised the City Marshals in person. I, Officer R. Moon, Officer N. Black, Officer L. Hanson, and three City Marshals maintained a post at Lewis and Casino Center. Officer J. Downing took down plate numbers of three unattended vehicles in the secured area and reported those to control. Upon all clear, I was told to return to the Phoenix Building to resume my duties and did so. The device was later determined to be some type of advertising equipment and at this time Las Vegas Metro Police are still investigating.
